Then, choose **TWO** of the activities below to complete. This is a major grade. Be neat accurate, and creative!

- Create a diary as a child living in Denmark during World War II. You may be a Jewish child or a friend of a Jewish child. Be sure to reflect upon the dangers of life at this time. Your entries must **address food rationing, the Nazi soldiers, the war, the Holocaust, and possible escape**. You must have at least five diary entries. If you use a word document to type your diary, you must use black ink, 12 point font, and Times New Roman, because that will look most like a typed entry from a typewriter. There were no computers then!

- Create a newspaper article that could have appeared in the Resistance newspaper, De Frie Danske (The Free Danes). You may write about any of the events occurring in WWII, the treatment of the Jews and others by the German government, important information for the Jews and possible escape from the Nazis, or information about the Resistance. Again, use 12 point font, Times New Roman, and black ink.
